#1	Video 1	Open the <b>Control Panel</b> by clicking on <b>Start &gt; Settings &gt;</b> <b>Control Panel</b> . Click on the <b>Users and Passwords</b> icon. Then click on the <b>Advanced</b> tab. Under the <b>Advanced User</b> <b>Management</b> section, click on the <b>Advanced</b> button. The <b>Local</b> <b>Users and Groups</b> window will open.
#2	Video 2	In left windowpane of the Local Users and Groups window, click on the <b>Users</b> folder. Click on the <b>Action Menu</b> in the upper left corner of the window and select <b>New User</b> . A New User dialog box will open.
#3	Video 3	In the User name text box, type LocalUser1 and then press the Tab key. In the Full name text box, type John Doe and then press the Tab key. In the Description text box, type User and then press the Tab key. Type password for the Password. Do the same for Confirm password. Next, uncheck the User must change password at next logon box and then click the Create button. Create a second user account named LocalUser2, Full name type Jane Doe using the same method. After this is complete click on the Close button. Close the Local Users and Groups window by clicking on the X in the upper right corner of the window. Close the Users and Passwords box.
