

Video title: Text Editing and File Management

Step	Description
#1 Video 1	First, open the Notepad program. Click on Start > Programs > Accessories . Once it is open, click the Maximize button in the upper right corner of the window.
#2 Video 2	In the blank space, type This is a test. This is only a test. Next, click on the File Menu in the upper left-hand corner of the window and select Save As . This will open the Save As window. The default location should be My Documents . If it is not, select it from the Save in drop down menu. Next, in the File name text box, type testfile and click on Save .
#3 Video 3	The file is now saved to the hard drive. Close Notepad by clicking on the X in the upper right hand corner of the window. Open Windows Explorer . Click on Start > Programs > Windows Explorer .
#4 Video 4	In the left windowpane, locate My Documents. Click on My Documents once to display the folders contents. The text file testfile should be visible. Click on testfile once. Next, click on the File Menu in the upper left hand corner of the window and select Rename . Type newname and press the Enter key. Now, change the filename back to testfile by right clicking on the newname text file. Select Rename and type testfile and then press the Enter key.
#5 Video 5	Insert a formatted floppy disk into the floppy drive. Navigate to the 3.5-inch floppy drive icon using the left windowpane of Windows Explorer. Click on the plus sign (+) next to the My Computer icon to expand it. Double click on the 3.5 Floppy (A:) icon to display the contents of the drive. Next, create a new folder on the floppy disk. Click on the File Menu in the upper left hand corner. Select New and then Folder . Name the folder my test folder .
#6 Video 6	Move the text file testfile to the newly created folder my test folder on the floppy disk. Navigate to My Documents in the left windowpane of Windows Explorer. Click on My Documents once to display the contents. Click on testfile once and then click on the Edit Menu in the upper left hand corner of the window. Select Cut . Now navigate back to the folder that was created on the 3.5-inch floppy drive. Click on the 3.5 Floppy icon to display the contents. Double-click on my test folder . Next, click on the Edit Menu and select Paste . Finally, verify that the file was moved. Navigate back to My Documents to make sure that is not there anymore. Now, navigate back to my test folder on the floppy drive to make sure that the text file testfile is there.
